AVAILABILITY - Which days/nights are you available to teach? Classes are usually scheduled to start at 6:00 or 6:30 PM (Monday - Wednesday evenings) and are held at the Nock Middle School on Low Street. If appropriate, some classes may be held via Zoom, offsite, days, or weekends.

The maximum number of weeks for a class to run is 8 weeks. Many classes are 4, 5 or 6 weeks in length; 1 or 2 night “workshops” are also popular. Classes are typically 1.5 or 2 hours in length. ***Everyone must be out of the building no later than 8:30pm.*** Please plan your time/content accordingly. A minimum of 4 students is required for a class to run.

**** IMPORTANT INFORMATION ****

All new teachers are required to provide a completed **W-9 form, CORI form, and a copy of your license**. These forms will be emailed to you when your proposal has been accepted. Please return ASAP before your class starts and so you can get paid.

We will typically know 2-4 days before class begins whether or not enough students have registered for your class for it to run. **We will email you the names and emails of all registrants. Feel free to email them before class to make an intro. Please print that email and bring it with you on the first night of class as it will serve as your attendance sheet.** Please inform us if there was anyone in attendance who was not on that roster so we can follow up.

On the first night of classes, the room assignments will be listed on a white board located in the main entrance of the Middle School (which faces Low Street), with directions to the room. ** There is no entry into the building from the side doors facing the large parking lot.

On the last night of class, please hand out the class/teacher evaluation forms to all students and put the completed forms in the **mailbox on the door of the Adult Ed office next to the library. Across from room 126.**

** Leave no trace. Per the administration, teachers and students **MUST** leave the classrooms exactly as they found them, including chairs and desk placements, whiteboard. Students must take their coffee cups, water bottles, etc. with them.

***Please note that if there is no school for the following reasons: school holiday, school vacation, or inclement weather, etc., there will also be no adult ed classes.** Check our website, Facebook and Instagram for updates.
